From 1986 to 1990 he practiced from his own office in Milan at the same time also collaborating with Prof. Aldo Rossi and Prof. Gianni Braghieri as a design architect in the Architecture Office of the latter. From 1991 to 1995 he lived and worked in Cuneo, Italy, practising from his own office. From 1985 to 1996 he taught at the Faculty of Architecture of Turin Polytechnic and at the European Institute of Design in Milan and Turin. In 1989 and 1991 he was invited by the School of Architecture of RMIT University as a visiting critic in the Design & Urban Design Masters Program. From 1996 he has been living in Melbourne, where he is currently working as both a lecturer in the School of Architecture of RMIT University and a practising architect in association in his own studio Baracco + Wright. From 1985 to 1995 he was a collaborator of Domus magazine; from 1991 to 1994 he was an editorial correspondent of Transition magazine. He has participated in numerous architecture competitions receiving prizes and honourable mentions. Some of his projects and built works have been published in books and magazines, and shown in national and international exhibitions. He has presented papers at several conferences, and his theoretical thought has been extensively published in books, magazines and journals. He is currently writing a book on the work and thought of Melbourne architect Robin Boyd, a topic that is closely related to his PhD research at the School of Architecture of RMIT University.
