

Prof. Elizabeth Sikiaridi lectures since 1997 on design in the urban landscape at the University of Duisburg-Essen and at the University of Applied Sciences Ostwestfalen-Lippe.

Elizabeth was born in London and grew up in Athens. She studied architecture and urbanism at the École d'Architecture de Belleville in Paris and at the Technical University of Darmstadt (graduation with honours). She worked at the architectural office Behnisch & Partner in Stuttgart on the Extension of the German Federal Bank in Frankfurt and on the German Federal Parliament in Bonn. Elizabeth was Assistant Professor at the Faculty of Architecture of the Technical University of Berlin.

Prof. Elizabeth Sikiaridi is co-founder of **Hybrid Space Lab**, Berlin, a r&d and design practice focusing on the hybrid fields that are emerging through the combination and fusion of environments, objects and services in the information-communication age.

Hybrid Space Lab is a lab and a network in which architects, urbanists, landscape architects and environmental planners, designers, soft- and hardware engineers collaborate in the development of projects for combined analog and digital, urban, architectural, design and media spaces. The scope of the research and development projects ranges from those on urban games and urban planning to buildings, architectural interiors and industrial design applications and wearables.

Elizabeth has worked broadly internationally: Austria, Belgium, Canada, China and Hong Kong, Czech Republic, Denmark, Germany, Greece, Finland, France, Italy, Latvia, Lithuania, Pakistan, Poland, Portugal, Oman, Singapore, South Korea, Switzerland, Spain, The Netherlands, Turkey, UK, USA.
