Subject: Call for admission to degree courses of the School of Design for the 2026/2027 A.Y.

HAVING IDENTIFIED the need to define the methods and contents of the admission tests to study programmes activated at the School of Design;

PENDING the deliberation to be adopted by the Academic Senate on the determination of the set quota and the foreign contingent for the 2026/2027 Academic Year;

PENDING the issuance of the Ministerial Decrees on locally planned degree courses;

PENDING the issuance of ministerial circulars on: "Procedures for the entry, residency and enrolment, and the respective recognition of qualifications, of international students in higher education courses in Italy" for the 2026/2027 a.y..

ORDERS

The issuance of the Call for admission to degree courses of the School of Design for the 2026/2027 a.y.:

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ART. 1 - Access to degree courses of the School of Design

The admission of students to degree courses of the School of Design, indicated in the table at Art. 5, is subject to taking an admission test (TOLD - *Test del Design*).

1.2 - Language skills

The degree courses delivered by Politecnico di Milano are divided into: courses “**in Italian**” and courses “**in English**”.

1.2.1 Access to programmes in Italian

To access the degree courses delivered in Italian, the following conditions are required:

- knowledge of the Italian language, which is an admission requirement to be demonstrated before enrolment;
- knowledge of the English language, without which enrolment is possible though with the assignment of any OFA “Additional educational obligations” with career limitations as described in Art. 7.

Knowledge of the Italian language need not be demonstrated by applicants who:

- are citizens of either Italy or the Republic of San Marino or the Swiss Canton of Ticino;
- have a qualification, at least upper secondary school level, obtained in Italian.

All other applicants must have an appropriate B2 level certification of proficiency in the Italian language issued by the CLIQ (Certificazione Lingua Italiana di Qualità).

Knowledge of the English language need not be demonstrated by applicants who:

- have taken a TOLD, providing at least 24 correct answers in the English section;
- are citizens of a country where English is the official language: United Kingdom, USA, Canada, Ireland, Australia, Anguilla, Grenada, Jamaica, New Zealand, Antigua and Barbuda, Dominica, Falkland Islands, Bahamas, Bermuda, Belize, Gibraltar, St. Helena, Trinidad and Tobago, Malta;
- have a qualification, at least upper secondary school level, obtained in English.

1.2.2 Access to the programme in English

To access the degree course delivered in English, the following conditions are required:

- knowledge of the English language, which is an admission requirement to be demonstrated before enrolment;
- knowledge of the Italian language, without which enrolment is possible though with the possible assignment of OFA "Additional educational obligations" as described in Art. 8 below.

Knowledge of the English language need not be demonstrated by applicants who:

- are citizens of a country where English is the official language: United Kingdom, USA, Canada, Ireland, Australia, Anguilla, Grenada, Jamaica, New Zealand, Antigua and Barbuda, Dominica, Falkland Islands, Bahamas, Bermuda, Belize, Gibraltar, St. Helena, Trinidad and Tobago, Malta;
- have a qualification, at least upper secondary school level, obtained in English.

All other applicants must have an appropriate certification of English language proficiency as specified on the Web page: <https://www.polimi.it/en/students/language-requirements>

Knowledge of the Italian language need not be demonstrated by applicants who:

- have taken a TOLD, obtaining a score of at least 30/100;
- are citizens of either Italy or the Republic of San Marino or the Swiss Canton of Ticino;
- have a qualification, at least upper secondary school level, obtained in Italian.

ART. 2 - Admission test, registration periods and methods

Politecnico di Milano will organise two admission tests, one in Italian and one in English.

There are two separate time slots for the test in Italian:

- **first time slot for test in Italian:** 1 March 2026 to 11 April 2026;
- **second time slot for test in Italian:** 12 April 2026 to 31 May 2026;

For the test in English, there is only one time slot:

- **single time slot for test in English:** 14 March 2026 to 14 May 2026;

Italian and equivalent applicants and non-EU applicants from the so-called reserved contingent who intend to take the test in Italian may register **for only one date for each time slot**; the best score will be taken into account for the formulation of rankings.

Italian and equivalent applicants and non-EU applicants from the so-called reserved contingent who intend to take the test in English may register **for only one date**.

Non-EU applicants from the so-called reserved contingent indicated in Italian Legislative Decree 25.7.1998, no. 286, Art. 39 - paragraph 5, as amended by Art. 26 of Italian Law

30.7.2002, no. 189, may access degree courses in Design as and by the deadlines set out in the previous articles.

Applicants in a position suitable for enrolment must complete their application for a student visa through the University portal as regulated by the Ministry circular containing the "Procedures for the entry, residency and enrolment, and the respective recognition of qualifications, of international students in higher education courses in Italy".

Applicants may register for the admission test **until the available places have been filled**, in accordance with the calendar shown in the registration process on Online Services at www.polimi.it/servizionline > *lauree triennali e a ciclo unico: test di ingresso o di recupero ed immatricolazione* [Laurea (equivalent to Bachelor of Science) and single cycle degree programmes: entry or remedial test and enrolment].

Registration for the test must be made via Online Services, subject to paying a €35.00 fee.

Registration is not completed solely by making the payment; the relevant procedure must be concluded, obtaining the test registration receipt.

The registration fee will not be reimbursed unless the test is not held for reasons attributable to Politecnico di Milano.

When registering for the Admission Test **in Italian**, applicants may express, in order of priority, up to four preferences, choosing only from the degree courses delivered by the School of Design in Italian.

When registering for the admission test **in English**, applicants will not express any preference and will compete only for the degree course delivered by the School of Design in English.

ART. 3 - Admission test: indications on its conduct, content and duration

The Design Test (TOLD), delivered in Italian or English, will take place in the University's computer rooms using personal computers.

The applicant must attend the classroom on the day and time indicated on the receipt. **Applicants will not be admitted to the classroom on days and times other than those shown on the receipt.**

In order to be admitted to take the Design Test (TOLD), applicants must produce a valid identity document, complete with photograph (identity card, driving licence, passport. Non-EU applicants from the so-called contingent are admitted only if they have a passport).

The Invigilator may not admit to the test any applicant who attends without an identity document, except in exceptional, adequately motivated cases.

A list of registered students who may be admitted is kept in each classroom.

Applicants are advised to bring with them the registration receipt so that any checks regarding the time, day and classroom of taking the test can be carried out.

When establishing applicants' identity by checking their identity document, the Invigilator will ask them to sign the attendance register for taking the test. That act must be completed before starting the test. The attendance register records any absent applicants.

If applicants leave the room for exceptional reasons, this will be noted in the classroom report and will in any case be considered equivalent to taking the test for the purposes of its repeatability.

Any applicant who does not attend will be considered absent and this will in any case be considered equivalent to taking the test for the purposes of its repeatability.

Before the test starts, the Invigilator will read the instruction sheet.

Applicants may not, under penalty of invalidity, interact with others during the test, bring into or use in the classroom mobile telephones, palmtops, smartphones, smartwatches or other such devices, as well as manuals, school texts, handwritten notes and consultation material.

Applicants who do not respect the foregoing will be removed from the classroom and their test cancelled.

It is not permitted to take away from the classroom the instructions and any sheets of notes used.

Art. 3.1 Test content and duration

The test, **written in Italian**, consists of **90 multiple choice questions**; applicants must choose the correct answer from the five available options.

The total test duration is **1 hour and 25 minutes (85 minutes)**.

The test, **written in English**, consists of **60 multiple choice questions**; applicants must choose the correct answer from the five available options.

The total test duration is **1 hour and 10 minutes (70 minutes)**.

The topics and questions included in the test will be:

- **geometry and representation (12 questions)** to be answered in 20 minutes)
- **logic (6 questions)** to be answered in 10 minutes)
- **verbal comprehension (6 questions)** to be answered in 10 minutes)
- **history of design, history of art (12 questions)** to be answered in 10 minutes)
- **general culture (24 questions)** to be answered in 20 minutes)
- **English knowledge (30 questions)** to be answered in 15 minutes); **this themed area will not be included in the English test.**

The questions will be focused on the programmes indicated below.

GEOMETRY AND REPRESENTATION

The test is aimed at verifying knowledge of the foundations of analytical geometry and Euclidean geometry, the capacity to resolve cases or abstract problems whose solution requires different types of logical reasoning.

Furthermore, the test will verify the ability to analyse graphics, design and iconic representations or terms of correspondence with respect to the presented subject, and the mastery of elementary notions of visual representation will be assessed.

LOGIC

This section will test abstract reasoning skills through problems formulated verbally or symbolically. Answering these questions requires the ability to work with sets; to recognise hypotheses and theses of a claim and if a given fact is necessary or sufficient; to analyse the correctness of a claim, identifying any errors of reasoning.

VERBAL COMPREHENSION

The questions will focus on non-fiction and fiction texts, or on texts published in newspapers or magazines of all types, and they will be aimed at verifying the level of linguistic mastery and at ascertaining the ability to build reasoning coherent with the premises of the proposed texts.

HISTORY OF DESIGN, HISTORY OF ART

The questions in this section will focus on events and protagonists of major historical importance in each era and place, and will verify the ability of chronological orientation with respect to the different eras. The questions will also concern the evolution of artistic manifestations from antiquity to the present day, and the history of industrial design, with its key figures, products and specific events.

GENERAL CULTURE

The questions will concern various areas of disciplinary knowledge studied in all school training courses; furthermore, the questions will be aimed at verifying general knowledge of history, technology, politics and social issues.

ENGLISH

The questions are aimed at testing the understanding of texts written mainly in everyday language, such as the description of events, feelings, desires.

ART. 4- Applicants with Disabilities, Certified Critical Health Conditions, Neurodifferences (Specific Learning Disorders and Autism Spectrum Disorders)

When registering for the admission tests, applicants may indicate whether they intend to request compensatory aid and/or tools. These will only be confirmed after specific evaluation by Politecnico di Milano – Equal Opportunities Unit.

The Equal Opportunities Unit - Multichance Poli Team of Politecnico will contact applicants with disabilities, certified critical health conditions and/or ASD, to verify their clinical or disability certifications, assess their specific needs and establish the methods of carrying out the tests indicated in this call for applications in accordance with Italian Law 104/1992 as amended.

In the case of a Specific Learning Disorder (SLD), the Equal Opportunities Unit - Multichance Poli Team of Politecnico verifies the suitability of the certification following applicants' request to carry out the tests indicated in this call for applications in accordance with Italian Law 170/2010 and the related MIUR Guidelines.

Such certifications must have been issued, no more than 3 years before, by the National Health Authorities or by specialists and facilities accredited by the same, on the model of the Consensus Conference, attaching the tests carried out and the scores achieved during the last assessment, in conformity with the note of the Lombardy Regional Government dated 5 July 2011 on SLD certification.

For organisational reasons, applicants with Specific Learning Disorders (SLDs) requiring compensatory tools to carry out the tests indicated in this call for applications must register for the test no later than 48 hours before the registration closing date.

ART. 5 – Degree courses

Pending Academic Senate approval, the study programmes, language and location of the courses for the-2026/2027 a.y. are:

ART. 6 - Attribution of scores and criteria for forming the ranking

At the end of the admission tests, separate rankings are published based on the language in which the test was taken; the rankings are formulated based on the score obtained, the preferences expressed and the available places.

The score of the Design Test is calculated automatically according to the following criteria:

- 1) Each individual question of the Design Test is attributed:
 - 1 mark if the answer is correct;
 - 0.25 marks in deduction if the answer is incorrect;
 - 0 (zero) marks if the answer is not given.
- 2) For each of the six Sections of the Design Test, the partial score is calculated by adding together the marks for the individual questions of that Section.
- 3) For each of the six Sections of the Design Test, the partial weighted score is calculated by multiplying the partial score by the “weight” of the Section.

See, in that regard, the Table below:

4) The "weighted totS" Test score is calculated as the sum of the six partial weighted scores, namely:

$$\text{Weighted totS} = 1.5 \cdot \text{cS} + 1.5 \cdot \text{gS} + 1.5 \cdot \text{hS} + 1.5 \cdot \text{IS} + 1.5 \cdot \text{vS} + 1/3 \cdot \text{eS}.$$

5) This "Weighted totS" score will be used for the admission rankings, the maximum achievable is **100.00 for the test in Italian and 90.00 for the test in English** and, for both, it is expressed rounded to the second decimal place.

Only students who have met both requirements indicated in points 1) and 2) will be admitted to the ranking:

- 1) Having correctly answered **a minimum number of questions for each section** as shown in the table below. **Failure to meet the minimum number of questions in one of the sections will exclude the applicant from the ranking:**

- 2) For the test in **Italian**, obtaining a **total weighted score equal to or greater than the total minimum threshold** amounting to:
 - - thirty one-hundredths (30.00/100.00) for "Italian EU and equivalent" students;

- twenty one-hundredths (20.00/100.00) for students from the “reserved contingent”;

For the test in **English**, obtaining a **total weighted score equal to or greater than the total minimum threshold** amounting to:

- twenty-seven one-hundredths (27.00/90.00) for “Italian EU and equivalent” students;
- eighteen one-hundredths (18.00/90.00) for students from the “reserved contingent”;

If the test scores are equal, the highest score achieved in the “geometry and representation” section will prevail; if the scores are still equal, the highest score achieved in the “verbal comprehension” section will prevail; if the scores are still equal, the highest score achieved in the “history of design, history of art” section will prevail; if the scores are still equal, the highest score achieved in the “logic” section will prevail; if the scores are still equal, the highest score achieved in the “general culture” section will prevail; if the scores are still equal, the highest score in the “English” section will prevail (this criterion is only used for the test in Italian; for the test in English, the subsequent criterion will be immediately assessed); finally, if the scores are still equal, the youngest student will be chosen.

In each ranking, the applicants will be assigned only one suitable position for enrolment until the available places have been filled.

In each ranking for admission to the degree courses, the applicant may be in one of the following positions:

ASSIGNED: the applicant falls within the available places for the preference that has highest priority among those expressed.

In this position **the applicant is required to enrol** by the specific deadlines set out in the Articles below, in which case s/he will no longer be considered in the rankings. If the applicant does not enrol by the deadlines and in the manner required, the **applicant will be deemed to have withdrawn**.

RESERVED: (this position does not apply to admission rankings for the degree course delivered in English) the applicant falls within the available places for a preference other than the one that has highest priority among those expressed.

In this position, **the applicant may enrol** by the specific deadlines set out in the Articles below and in the manner required, in which case s/he will no longer be considered in the subsequent rankings, or **may express his or her interest in being considered in the**

subsequent ranking by the specific deadlines and in the manner set out in the Articles below. If the applicant fails to enrol or express his or her interest in being considered in the subsequent ranking by the deadlines and in the manner required, the applicant **will be deemed to have withdrawn**.

PENDING: the applicant does not fall within any of the courses listed in order of preference because the available places in the published ranking have already been assigned or reserved.

In this position, the applicant **may express his/her interest in being considered in the subsequent ranking** by the specific deadlines and in the manner set out in the Articles below. If the applicant fails to express his or her interest in being considered in the subsequent ranking by the deadlines and in the manner required, the applicant **will be deemed to have withdrawn**.

COURSE FULL: the applicant is no longer able to enrol because the courses indicated in his or her preferences have no places available for the 2026/2027 a.y..

Taking into account the order of preferences expressed and the score obtained by the applicant, the latter's ranking positions will not be processed in relation to the preferences following the one for which the applicant is eligible for enrolment, i.e. in the ASSIGNED or RESERVED position.

For applicants from the reserved contingent, separate rankings are established based on the same requirements set out above.

For each enrolment phase, the following will be published online on the Official Register of the University: www.protocollo.polimi.it/albo

- **a general ranking in order of identification code;**
- **a ranking for each degree course in order of test score.**

Art. 7. - CAREER LIMITATIONS LINKED TO ENGLISH OFA AND THEIR FULFILMENT

Students who have not demonstrated knowledge of the English language as indicated in Art.1.2 are attributed ENGLISH OFA Additional educational obligations, which result in the following prohibitions in formulating the study plan:

- prohibition on inserting extra-curriculum courses;
- prohibition on including courses from programme years after that of enrolment;
- prohibition on submitting an independent study plan.

ENGLISH OFA may be recovered in one of the following ways:

- by delivering to the Registrar's Office one of the certifications recognised by Politecnico di Milano indicated in the specific section of the Politecnico website www.polimi.it: Info for - *Enrolled students > Language requirements: English and Italian > Students of an Italian-Language Laurea Study Programme* in the table

"certifications required";

or

- by taking part in specific tests organised by external bodies partnered with Politecnico di Milano, as specified on www.polimi.it: Info for - *enrolled students* > *Language requirements: English and Italian* > *external bodies*.

ART. 8. - CAREER LIMITATIONS LINKED TO ITALIAN OFA AND THEIR FULFILMENT

Students who have not demonstrated knowledge of the Italian language as indicated in Art.1.2 are attributed ITALIAN OFA Additional educational obligations to be fulfilled before taking their graduation exam and completing their studies.

To complete the ITALIAN OFA applicants may:

- submit a B2 level certification recognised by the MUR based on the circular "foreign students", quality system CLIQ (Certificazione Lingua Italiana di Qualità), to the Registrar's Office through: <https://www.polimi.it/contatti-studenti>;

or

- take an Italian course free of charge (the level of which will be determined on the preliminary level test).

The course will be organised by Politecnico di Milano and will allow those who have attended at least 75% of lectures to take a final test for fulfilling their OFA Additional educational obligations.

ART. 9 - Enrolment periods and procedure

For Italian and equivalent applicants, the rankings will be published on the University register at www.protocollo.polimi.it/albo from **10:30am on 08/06/2026**, followed by the sliding rankings as described in detail below.

Applicants in a suitable position for enrolment may enrol **from 10:30am on 08/06/2026 to 11:59:59pm on 10/06/2026**.

Enrolment is made only by accessing Online Services at www.polimi.it/servizionline > *Lauree triennali e a ciclo unico: test di ingresso o di recupero ed immatricolazione* [Bachelor and Single-Cycle degrees: admission or remedial test and enrolment], paying the first instalment of the tuition fees for the 2026/2027 Academic Year.

Applicants whose position is either "**RESERVED**" or "**PENDING**" may express their interest in being considered in the subsequent ranking **from 10:30am on 8 June 2025 to 11:59:59am on 11/06/2026**.

Other four ranking lists will then be published for applicants who have expressed their interest in participating following the position obtained in the previous ranking, the deadlines of which are as follows:

Starting from 10:30am on 01/09/2026, after the end of the enrolment period of the “Fifth ranking list” and after considering any withdrawals received, any places still available in the degree courses will be published. Applicants may ask to be considered for the rankings by including new preferences in order of priority by 11:59:59am on 03/09/2026.

The rankings of this “SECOND PHASE” will be published on the University register at www.protocollo.polimi.it/register from 10:30am on 07/09/2026:

- Applicants whose position is “ASSIGNED” may enrol from 10:30am on 07/09/2026 to 11:59:59pm on 09/09/2026

The University reserves the right to initiate an additional phase, should there be unfilled places. This phase follows a similar procedure to the one described herein, with applicants submitting new preferences.

ART. 11 - Head of the procedure

ART. 12 - Rules of reference

For anything not contained in this Call, reference is made to existing relevant regulations.

ART. 13 – Data processing

Personal data processing is carried out under EU Regulation no. 679/2016 on the protection of personal data. All data provided will be processed only for institutional purposes connected with and essential for the admission procedures to the Politecnico di Milano degree courses.

Data will be processed by suitably authorised staff.
