Destinatari

Undergraduate and graduate students who are interested in design, strategies, change management and facility management, as well as the effects of new working spaces on the workers, urban space and peripheral areas.

Researchers who are investigating the social, economic and environmental impact of the most recent working space changes, and those who have joined the CA18214 or are interested in the topic of the action.

The maximum number is 50 participants.*

Requisiti:

Course participants will be evaluated through a pre-selection procedure. Candidates will be selected on the basis of:

– Short CV (based on the experiences most relevant to the topics of the course);

– Age (priority is given to younger candidates).

The course is held in English.

Contenuti

By referring to the 'COST Action CA18214', in which lecturers and organizers are involved, and by presenting preliminary outcomes of the CA18214, the participants of the summer school will get a comprehensive overview of the current knowledge on the new working spaces such as **coworking spaces** and new trends in the local and international contexts.

The nature of work has been evolving recently, along with the way working spaces are used. This dynamic has major implications for working space design, management and location that need to respond to new challenges. This course will assist students, practitioners and researchers to engage with these ongoing evolutions.

Participants will learn to:

- Integrate different disciplines in a sound reasoning around the workplace, with a focus on coworking spaces;
- Manage planning and policy tools in fostering coworking space diffusion;
- Picture the future evolution of workplaces and its impact at the building and local scale, both in core and peripheral areas.

Programma

The school is co-organized by COST Action CA18214 "The geography of New Working Spaces and the impact on the periphery", Department of Architecture, Built environment and Construction engineering (DABC), Department of Architecture and Urban Studies (DASTU) at Polimi, with Dipartimento di Eccellenza Fragilità Territoriali and the Real Estate Center of DABC – Polimi. The course targets students and researchers. Students can have the opportunity to freely access to the Evento di Formazione Permanente "Planning, Design and Management of Workplaces – Theory and Case histories of coworking space", that will take place late afternoon, after the end of the school's lessons.
